LOCAL TEENAGERS LEADING BY EXAMPLE Police have praised local teenagers for reporting men acting suspiciously in the Tigers Bay area. As a result of a police follow up operation three significant arrests were made in relation to serious crime. Chief Inspector Muir Clarke has personally spoken to the children and their parents, to congratulate them on their responsible quick action which helped apprehend these criminals. Reporting suspicious behaviour often leads to crime being averted. In this case young people have lead by example by reporting suspicious activity directly to police. The community should be extremely proud that as a result, serious crime in this area, and beyond, has been dealt a severe blow. Well done our young people!!

Tigers Bay Lookin Good!

Tigers Bay is at the forefront of the Arts Council re-imaging initiative. Funding of £126,000, managed by Groundwork NI, was

secured by Tigers Bay Concerned Residents group to deliver the re-imaging project in Tigers Bay. Following a period of consultation with local community groups, families associated with the murals and local schoolchildren, a programme of work was developed which will help to brighten up our area. Ross Wilson, a famous Northern Ireland artist, has been commissioned to support the re-imaging project. He is currently working on three initiatives. This includes creating a piece of 3D metal artwork to compliment the new Tigers Bay mural at the junction of North Queen Street and Cultra Street, working with children to create a wall mural painted on wooden boards for erecting on a gable wall at the top of Hogarth Street/ Edlingham Street and creating a bronze sculpture to be sited in the oval at Hallidays Road.

Tigers Bay Bonfire Committee have announced significant changes to this years bonfire celebrations. Following disappointment associated with the behaviour of drunks at last years bonfire in Adam Street and the location of the site in relation to the peace line, we have decided that this years event will be focussed on promoting the cultural aspects of bonfires and providing a safe, secure and happy environment for children, the community and older people to enjoy. This year, Tigers Bay Bonfire Committee will be following in the foot steps of the Woodvale community by burning a bonfire beacon. This will be supported by a range of complimentary activities and events organised on an alcohol free basis. Contrary to rumours circulating around the community, this initiative is not about stopping bonfires in Tigers Bay or Mountcollyer, rather it is about promoting the positive aspects of our culture, free from alcohol, violence and other anti-social elements that have, over recent years, ruined the ability of our community to safely celebrate this important night. There will no doubt be other bonfires in the Tigers Bay and Mountcollyer areas and we would appeal to those organising them to liaise with police, fire service and other relevant agencies to ensure they pass off as safely and as peaceful as possible in order to avoid and minimise the problems experienced in previous years.
